Thang: Part III Meal sharing / the Liturgy of the Eucharist

After the readings, we move to the table. As at a meal in the house of a friend, we set the table, say grace and share the food (we eat and drink). At Mass these ritual actions are called the Preparation of the Offerings, the Eucharistic Prayer, and the Communion Rite.

Preparation of the Offerings

In our parish, the school communities have recently rostered their children to share in bringing the gifts/offerings of bread and wine to the priest. Also, members of the parish take up a first collection from the worshipping community to support the running costs of the parish. The presider places the bread and wine on the altar. He then mixes water with the wine and washes his hands to help us think of the Last Supper. Finally he invites us to stand and pray with him so that the sacrifice may be acceptable to God.

The Eucharistic Prayer

On behalf of the worshipping community, the presider begins with the thanksgiving (*preface*), glorifies God and gives thanks for the whole work of salvation, or for some special aspect of it that fits to the day, festivity, or season. Then the presider implores through the power of the Holy Spirit that the gifts offered by the worshipping community be consecrated, to become the Body and Blood of Christ. After that the presider says the words of institution narrative and consecration. This is followed by the recalling of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. After gratefully calling to mind all the wonderful saving actions God has done for us in the past, the presider petitions God to continue those actions of Christ in the present that we may become one body, one spirit in Christ.

On the parts of the worshipping community, we can take part at the opening greeting and dialogue of the *preface*. Then there is the *Holy Holy*, which is the major acclamation of the Mass. Following the words of consecration, there is the Memorial Acclamation, a statement of the core of Christian beliefs: We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again (or one of the other choices which are equivalent). There is the *Great Amen* in which all that has gone before is summed by the worshipping community. After this we stand.

The Communion Rite

The presider invites us to recite/sing the prayer (*Our Father*) taught us by Jesus: We pray for God's reign to be known and loved; we pray for our daily bread; we ask God to forgive us our faults as we forgive those who wrong us. This implies that Communion – union with, is the sign and source of our reconciliation and union with God and with one another. We then make a gesture of union, forgiveness and reaching out to others and offer them a sign of peace.

The breaking of bread is the action which commemorates Jesus' action at the Lord's Supper. As St Paul teaches, it is because we all eat part of this one loaf (Christ) that we are one Body (Body of Christ = Church). During the ritual, we recite/sing Lamb of God.

As God fed our ancestors in the desert, so God gives us food for our journey. We approach the minister who gives us the Eucharistic Bread (the Host) with the words: the Body of Christ, and we respond, Amen. We then go to the minister with the cup who offers it to us with the words: the Blood of Christ, to which we again profess, Amen. During this time, we normally sing a hymn which unites our voices, minds and thoughts, just as the Body and Blood of Christ unites our bodies.

This time is also a time to pray silently, thanking and praising God and asking for our needs.

After the Communion, we also take up a second collection to support the local priests and other priests in the Archdiocese for their living allowances. This is to say that the congregation does look after those who serve. After this the presider unites our prayers in the *Prayer after Communion*, to which we respond, Amen.

Understanding the Mass for Children

We receive the Body and Blood of Christ

This is called: Receiving Communion, or The Eucharist

What happens?

Mary Immaculate students, who are making their First Holy Communion this weekend, will go forward to the altar to receive the Body of Christ, which still looks like bread, and the Blood of Christ, which still tastes like wine. What does it mean?

When we receive the Body and Blood we say "Amen". We are saying that we believe that we are really receiving the Body and Blood of Christ. This brings us closer to God.
