Anointing of the Sick: Experiencing the Healing of Life

In close connection with the sacrament of Reconciliation, the Anointing of the Sick is another remedy for our fallen condition. These are also known as sacraments of healing. The scriptural texts on which the practice of anointing the sick have rested since the early days of the Church, Mk 6:7-13 and Jas 5:14-15, are connected with Jesus' and the early Church communities' attitude toward the sick. Mark's Gospel (6:7-13) indicates that the Twelve "anointed many sick people with oil and cured them." As the sacraments derive their power from the Paschal Mystery, Christ instructed that his disciples "lay their hands on the sick who will recover" (Mk 16:18). James' Letter (5:14-15) suggests that the elements of a sacrament are present, namely an outward sign of inward grace consisting of anointing with oil (the matter) and the prayer of the elder over the sick person (the form). Even though the institution by Christ of the Anointing is not explicit, it is nonetheless implicit in his ministry.

The Council of Trent considers the anointing in a single breath with penance as its special *completion*. This *complementary sacrament* corresponds above all to the situation of life coming to an end, in which the faithful are particularly threatened by the power of evil. Therefore it is called *Extreme Unction* or the last anointing / rites. Concerning the effect of the Anointing, the Council places the accent on James' Letter where it emphasises the forgiveness of sins. So the Anointing has to do with the grace of the Holy Spirit, whose anointing takes away the sins if there be any still to be expiated...it comforts and strengthens the soul of the sick person. Also the Council adds that the sick often achieve physical recovery when it advances the salvation of the soul. Overall, in the course of time, the focus of Anointing shifted from healing to forgiveness of sins and the time for receiving the sacrament was delayed to the deathbed when forgiveness of sins would also be the final preparation for eternal life.

Recent developments in human scientific knowledge has led to a better understanding of the relationship between physical, mental and spiritual healing, and liturgical developments, a renewal of patristic and scripture studies, a holistic approach to health and healing and the charismatic movement urged Vatican II to remedy the previous situation. The Council reminded the faithful that the liturgy is made up of immutable elements, divinely instituted, and of elements subject to change. These not only may but ought to be changed with the passage of time if they have suffered from the intrusion of anything out of harmony with the inner nature of the liturgy.

This was the case with *Extreme Unction*. As a result, the Council placed the Anointing once again in the context of mutual and communal prayer and concern as described in Jas 5:13-16 and which reflected more appropriately the ancient tradition. Anointing is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death but is intended for all those whose health is seriously affected by illness or old age. The technical word *periculose* means beginning to be in danger. The Anointing of the Sick can be administered to any member of the faithful who, having reached the use of reason, begins to be in danger of death by reason of illness or old age; this sacrament can be repeated if the sick person, having recovered, again becomes seriously or, in the same illness, is in the same danger. There are various kinds of illnesses: physical illness; stress; mid-life crisis; anxiety before a serious operation; mental illness; addictions; etc. Note that *old age* is not an illness but a natural part of life journey. To imply one is *seriously ill* simply *because you're old* can be insensitive.

Consequently, what we formerly called Extreme Unction is now more properly called the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. In perspective, viaticum (food for the journey) is restored as the true sacrament for the dying, and the Anointing of the Sick is restored as a sacrament for those seriously ill even if not at the point of death. The use of this sacrament is of concern to the whole Church:

"By the sacred anointing of the sick and the prayer of the priests, the whole Church commends those who are ill to the suffering and glorified Lord, asking that He may raise them up and save them (Jas 5:14-15). And indeed, it exhorts them to contribute to the welfare of the whole people of God by associating themselves freely with the passion and death of Christ." (LG, no. 11)

The new Rite commits the entire faith-community to the sick person, and its presence testifies to the sick that the Lord is present. So to celebrate the Anointing with the sick, especially those with terminal illnesses is to proclaim the place they hold in God's heart; it is to affirm their value and dignity, which invites us to treat them accordingly. As a part of the pastoral team at Austin Hospital, I have encountered many people who suffered from terminal illnesses. It is quite a rewarding experience in terms of ministry to the sick and their relatives. Overall, the effect of the revised naming of the sacrament of Anointing emphasises that the Lord Jesus saves and raises up the sick person, and its aim is a remedy for the whole person, body and soul. Above all, this sacrament brings the grace of salvation, of comfort and consolation to those who are sick and to relatives and friends.

Prayer of Anointing (forehead and the hands)

Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up.

Prayer after Anointing

Father in heaven, through this holy anointing grant our brothers and sisters comfort in their suffering. When they are afraid, give them courage, when afflicted, give them patience, when dejected, afford them hope, and when alone, assure them of the support of your holy people.
