From the desk of Fr Thang:

Understanding the Mass Part I of IV

For the next few weeks, the children from our three schools will receive and celebrate their First Holy Communion. It is a fitting occasion to revisit parts of the Eucharist / Mass.

The basic structure of the Mass perhaps can be described as a meal. However, this is not to ignore the Eucharist as sacrifice. When friends gather for a meal, we sit and talk: Eventually we move to the table, say grace, pass the food and eat and drink, and finally take our leave and go home. Put into the language of the Mass, we will see ritual acts: GATHERING, STORYTELLING, MEAL SHARING, and COMMISSIONING.

1 GATHERING/INTRODUCTORY RITES

This whole rite is structured to bring us together into one body, ready to listen and to break the bread together.

<u>Greeters:</u> In our churches there will be someone at the door/foyer to greet us as we arrive for Sunday Mass: we all like to be greeted and welcomed when we gather for a celebration. Hospitability is one of our Parish core Gospel values.

<u>Holy Water:</u> One of the first things we do when we come to church is dip our right hand in water and make the Sign of the Cross. This ritual reminds us of our Baptism: we were baptised with water and signed with the cross. At every Eucharist, we renew our promises: to die to sin in our relationships with God and our neighbours. It is Baptism that brings us to Mass. Traditionally we also kneel upon the right leg (genuflect) before sitting, looking at the Tabernacle and the Crucifix remembering Christ's crucifixion.

<u>Posture/Song/Hymn:</u> When the Eucharist begins, we stand up. Standing is the traditional posture of the Christian at prayer: It shows our attentiveness to the Word of God and our readiness to carry it out. Then we begin by singing together. This unifies our thoughts and voices in common word, rhythm and melody.

<u>Greeting:</u> The Presider will lead us to begin with the Sign of the Cross. Then he proclaims the Lord's presence in the community by greeting us one of the following: "The Lord be with you". We will hear this greeting frequently during Mass. It is both a wish, and a profound statement of faith. Our response to this greeting is now the formula, "And with your spirit," by which we return the greeting, the statement of faith.

<u>Penitential Act, Gloria:</u> All the other ritual acts of this first part of the Mass are intended to gather us together into a worshipping community. We are invited collectively and individually to pause, to recall our common need for salvation, to examine our conscience as to our relationship with God and with one another. Then a hymn of praise – The Gloria is sung or recited (during Advent and Lent, this hymn is excluded to express the penitential dimension of these seasons). The Gloria has been a part of the Mass since about the sixth century!

<u>Opening Prayer/Collect:</u> Let us pray - The Presider invites the worshipping community to pray. In the silence that follows, we focus on the fact that we are in God's presence and collect / gather or call to mind all the intentions we may bring to the Eucharistic Meal this day. The Collect is always prayed by the Presider in the name of the assembly. It may be sung. The Amen at the end is always prayed by the community. Amen, a Hebrew word, means "So let it be."

What happens?

- 1. At the start of the Mass, we sing a song together. This song is called a "hymn" (said like "him")
- 2. We make the Sign of the Cross together, and are greeted by the priest.
- 3. We then say the "Lord have Mercy" together.

What does it mean?

We come to Mass to celebrate our faith, and that Jesus died for us and rose again.

- 1. We begin the Mass with a hymn to help us come together as one community.
- 2. When the priest greets us, he is letting us know that God is present among us.
- 3. Before we listen to the readings and receive Jesus, we must first remember our sins, and be sorry for them.

Coming to the Eucharistic Meal on Sunday, knowing our dignity: In Baptism, we put on Christ. We are the Body of Christ. Vatican II, in the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, said that "full, conscious and active participation by all the faithful" is the "right and the duty" of all the faithful because of our Baptism (SC #14)
