# SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT: YEAR A

# **Lighting of the Second Advent candle:**



Today we again light the candle that was lit for the first time last week. The lighting of the second candle tells us that we are a little closer to Christmas. Today, in the Gospel, we hear the voice of John the Baptist crying out: 'Prepare a Way for the Lord'. Do we hear this as a challenge to prepare a welcome for those who come into our lives, offering them the acceptance and the **hospitality** for which every human heart longs.

# THE WORD

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart.

# RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever.

V. 1. O God, give your judgement to the king, to a king's son your justice, That he may judge your people in justice and your poor in right judgement. **R.** 

V. 2. In his days justice shall flourish and peace till the moon fails: He shall rule from sea to sea, from the Great River to earth's bounds. **R.** 

V. 3. For he shall save the poor when they cry and the needy who are helpless. He will have pity on the weak and save the lives of the poor. **R.** 

V. 4. May his name be blessed for ever and endure like the sun.Every tribe shall be blessed in him, all nations bless his name. R.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Alleluia, alleluia! Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

### From the desk of Fr Thang: Season of Advent (Part II): Companions for the Advent journey

### The Prophet Isaiah

Isaiah was a prophet who lived in the 8<sup>th</sup> century before the Birth of our Lord. He was both a politician and a poet, and his encouraging words would have the power to lift us out of our own world to a life that God is preparing for us. Isaiah's images tumble over one another in their exuberance. Last week we had an image of a joyful pilgrimage to high mountains where nations streamed into it, a place where pilgrims will be instructed in the ways of God.

Isaiah is the most frequently heard voice of the Advent season, not only on Sundays but on many of the weekdays. We are given Isaiah as a companion who turns us toward the future, that blank slate beyond our sight that can fill us with fear and anxiety.

Isaiah voices the hope and longing of God's people in exile as they await the time of their release. They dream of the days when God's rule will prevail and wars will cease, the days when "they shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks (Is 2:4)." We long for the time when all hatred and prejudice will cease, when the streets will be safe, and the elderly will not live in fear, when "the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the young lion shall browse together (11:6)."

In a world where there is so much violence, so much injustice of all kinds and so many disasters, we are called to remember Isaiah's image of dead stump sprouting a shoot that will bud and blossom into new life. Isaiah summons us to wait for joy.

### St John the Baptist

John the Baptist appears on the second and third Sundays. This Sunday, we are introduced to John's familiar features: a lone figure in the desert, dressed with camel skin, eating bugs and honey. His messages are blunt and direct: personal conversion, make our paths straight to prepare of the ways of the Lord. This is the John who does not have a moment of self-doubt or questioning, hurling his words at the local leaders. "Bunch of snakes," he shouts, "give me proof you are going to change." Not exactly someone we would want to run into while we were out pre-Christmas shopping.

And if we thought he was tough, it didn't take long for him to tell us he was only the warm-up for the main act. The One who is coming would sweep with a very big broom, and all who got caught in the bristles would be thrown into the fire. That's our John the Baptist!

On the third Sunday, we are presented with a very different John. Some time has passed in the gospel, and he has been put prison because of his critical sayings about the King Herod and his wife. He is assailed by doubt: "Are you really the Messiah who we await – you who are non-violent, forbearing and forgiving?" We can hear the desperation in his words.

This John is our companion when we are desperately waiting for something to make things dear in our life. When we sit in the silence of our prisons, feeling vulnerable, wondering if it has been worth it; whether the "it" is a job, a relationship, a marriage, or life itself, John joins us in our uncertainty, our doubts, and sits with us. He is a companion to us in the darkness of depression while we wait for the light to pierce what seems impenetrable.
