THE WORD

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our

salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and

delivered.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Do not forget the works of the Lord!

V. 1. Give heed, my people, to my teaching; turn your ear to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth in a parable and reveal hidden lessons of the past. **R.**

V. 2. When he slew them then they would seek him, return and seek him in earnest.

From the desk of Fr Thang: The Exaltation of the Holy Cross

On September 13, 2014 morning, together with Melbournian Presbyterates and the People of God we participated in the Ordinations of Priesthood and Deaconate. Archbishop Hart ordained three priests and six deacons which brought him nine extra joys. For me it was time to celebrate and renew the promises of my ordained ministries as deacon: "Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you have become. Believe what you read. Teach what you believe. Practice what you teach"; and as priest: "Receive the oblation of the holy people, to be offered to God. Understand what you do, imitate what you celebrate, and conform your life to the mystery of the Lord's Cross." As a 'baby' priest of just six years, I am still struggling with practice what I teach and finding the mystery of the Lord's Cross a daily challenge. Please continue to pray for and with us.

This weekend, we welcome the families and friends of the children from Mother of God Catholic Primary School, part of the Catholic Parish of Ivanhoe, who for the first time will receive Jesus through the gifts of the bread and the wine. Today is a very special day for these children. Please keep them in your prayers as they continue learning more about their faith. Please also pray for their families, as they support them on this journey.

Today's Feast originated in 4th Century, when St Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in search of the Holy places of Christ's life. The date of today's Feast commemorates the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre built by Constantine. During the excavation, workers found three crosses. According to a legend, the Cross on which Jesus died was identified when its touch healed a dying woman. The Cross immediately became an object of veneration. It remained in Jerusalem until the early 7th Century when the Persian king, Chosroes seized the city and took the Cross back to Persia. In 628 Emperor Heraclius overthrew the regime in Persia and carried the Cross, firstly to Constantinople, his capital city, and then in the spring of 629, to Jerusalem. Today's feast, the Triumph or the Exaltation of the Cross, commemorates this triumphant return of the Holy Cross to Jerusalem. According to a story, the Emperor intended to carry the Cross back into Jerusalem himself, but was unable to move forward until he took off his imperial garb and became a barefoot pilgrim.

Let's focus on the Word:

First Reading (Num 21:4-9): Suffering cruelty in their flesh because they had spoken against God, the Israelites can only be saved by looking at the bronze serpent raised on a standard.

Second Reading (Phil 2:6-11): We are invited to embrace the minds and heart of Christ: to the emptying himself even on the cross, which God's Servant desired, and come the response – his ascent into glory.

Gospel (Jn 3:13-17): God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life and so that, through him, the world might be saved. What more needs to be said!

Something to ponder and act on:

- When was the last time we blessed our meal with the Sign of the Cross?
- Ponder the many ways in which God has done everything for me. Be thankful.
- ❖ In what ways have I experienced the unselfish love of others? Be grateful.
- Learn by heart this scriptural text: God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life.
