From the desk of Fr Thang: Psalm 50 (51): A Lenten Psalm

Have mercy on me, God, in your kindness. In your compassion blot out my offence. O wash me more and more from my guilt and cleanse me from my sin.

My offences truly I know them; my sin is always before me. Against you, you alone, have I sinned; what is evil in your sight I have done.

That you may be justified when you give sentence and be without reproach when you judge,

O see, in guilt I was born, a sinner was I conceived.

Indeed you love truth in the heart; then in the secret of my heart teach me wisdom. O purify me, then I shall be clean; O wash me, I shall be whiter than snow.

Make me hear rejoicing and gladness, that the bones you have crushed may revive.

From my sins turn away your face and blot out all my guilt.

A pure heart create for me, O God, put a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, nor deprive me of your holy spirit.

Give me again the joy of your help; with a spirit of fervour sustain me, that I may teach transgressors your ways and sinners may return to you.

O rescue me, God, my helper, and my tongue shall ring out your goodness.

O Lord, open my lips and my mouth shall declare your praise.

For in sacrifice you take no delight, burnt offering from me you would refuse, my sacrifice, a contrite spirit.

A humbled, contrite heart you will not spurn.

In your goodness, show favour to Zion: rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. Then you will be pleased with lawful sacrifice, holocausts offered on your altar.

Background to Psalm 50 [2 Samuel ch. 11, 12]

2 Samuel chapter 11 recounts a story about King David, while walking on the roof of this palace, saw Bathsheba, who was then the wife or Uriah – a soldier, having a bath. He immediately desired her and later got her pregnant. In an effort to cover up his adultery, King David had Uriah killed in the front line of battle. The baby of this affair unfortunately died, Bathsheba was devastated. When confronted by the Prophet Nathan through a story of a rich man who took away the little lamb of his poor neighbour... "You are the man!" (Please read 2 Samuel Ch. 12), David admitted that he had sinned. It was into this context of disorientation that he traditionally wrote Psalm 50, acknowledging his sin and asking for forgiveness. For King David, confession, contrition and repentance were the first steps toward reorientation!

A closer look into the Psalm

Melbournian scriptural scholar Fr Mark O'Brien gives a helpful look into Psalm 50:

'The psalm portrays the healing, forgiving action of God in various images. God is like a benign judge who blots out the offence (does not keep piling up a dossier against the offender), like a devoted parent or host who washes away the grime of sin that stains the sinner (cf. the parable of the prodigal son), is the creator who alone can create a pure heart and a steadfast spirit, is one's faithful companion who remains loyal despite failures. The psalm also presents various images of sin: it is a rebellion ('offence'), a stain or disfigurement that marks the offender ('guilt'), and a straying from the right way (the term 'sin' often means to 'miss the mark/path'). The psalm ends by acknowledging that the restoration of the penitent is not just for his or her benefit but also for the community at large - to become a sign of God's compassion and thereby encourage others to 'return to you'. Another way of putting this is to say that an abiding sign of a restored and right relationship with God is that one becomes (again) God's disciple or servant, advancing and not impeding God's work of salvation.'

When reading the editorial, some may find difficulty with the notion of "a sinner was I conceived", the idea of a new born child being a 'sinner'! Yes, I agree too! Perhaps we should note that Psalm 50 is a personal reflection of a King after he committed adultery and murder. His words seem exaggerated! Also we may reflect that we humans were born into a notso-perfect world - pollution, disharmony between the elements and human beings e.g. earthquake, flood, typhoon... the seeds of sins and evils are already there when we were born! Alternatively we can reflect on Catholic teaching on original sin

Biblical Trivia:

- 1. Psalm 50 is also known as the great act of contrition, the *Miserere*. It is one of the 7 penitential psalms in the Psalter. Psalm 50 appears on most Fridays of the Morning Prayer of the Church.
- 2. Why are Psalms numbered differently? You might notice that there are 2 numbers for the Miserere Psalm (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=36Y_ztEW1NE). If we look on a Catholic Bible on Psalm 50, we won't find the words there. Instead they are found on the next Psalm - Ps. 51. There are two ways of numbering the Psalms: the Hebrew Masoretic version and the Greek - Septuagint version (Catholic version). Both versions are in circulation; we, Catholics use both systems. That is why you see references like Psalm 50 (51); Psalm 22 (23).

The first time numbering varies when the Hebrew psalms 9 and 10 are joined as the Greek psalm 9 which causes the Greek numbers to be one less than the Hebrew numbers for most of the 150 psalms. That is why the Hebrew Shepherd Psalm 23 gets number 22 in Greek numbering. Or the Miserere Psalm 50 gets number 51 in Hebrew version. Clear as mud!

3. Bathsheba is the mother of King Solomon.
