From the desk of Fr Thang: 100th anniversary of the first 'Anzac Day'

Last Sunday on a cold afternoon, I was privileged to attend our local annual Anzac March and Ceremony. Thanks for your prayers, the March and Ceremony were spared from heavy rain. Mr Fred Cullen OAM, the President of the Ivanhoe's RSL gave a powerful speech on this special occasion. What struck me was that Fred is in his 94th year! In addition, there was a big presence of young people. It was great to see some of our senior parishioners participating in this event.

At last year Premier's Spirit of Anzac Competition which focused on this question: 'To what extent do you think the Anzac Spirit is relevant today? What can it teach us about the Australia we want for the future?' Patrick Daly, a student from St Kevin's College, Toorak who won this competition, compared his life-saver activities to the spirit of Anzac: "Just like the Anzac Diggers relied upon their mates, we too rely on ours in times of need. The importance of mateship will ALWAYS be part of our Australian culture." Patrick's YouTube entry (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Ec-qDRZTDZU), titled Spirit of the Anzac – Today and in the Future, shows the pride and passion that Anzac Day generates in our youth today. Patrick concluded his video by saying: 'By building in future generations better understandings about the traditions, facts and folk-lore of Anzac Day the many real life stories of sacrifice and heroism in everyday Australians will not be lost.'

Liturgically, Anzac Day is:

- a martyr's day when we commemorate the sacrifice of the fallen and honour those who gave their life that we might live
- a Commemoration of the Dead when we commend those who have died in war to the Lord, especially members of our own families
- a prayer for peace, because all war is horrible no matter what heroism it reveals
- a day of national identity, an Australian "coming of age"
- a story of victory in defeat and survival in the face of overwhelming odds.

Above all, the Easter story and season permeate the spirit of ANZAC – self-sacrifice for the lives of others, mateship, courage and strength, new free lives of others. It is important to recognise that at the heart of the Australian psyche is the mystery which we commemorate in the death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

At Communion, we will listen to the sombre Soprano and choir of the well-known verse from Laurence Binyon's Poem, "For the Fallen":
