## FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT: YEAR C



### Lighting of the Fourth Advent candle:

Mary's time of waiting - and ours - has nearly reached its end. As we light the fourth candle, we remind ourselves that Jesus birth in time was the beginning of his mission - a mission he calls us to share in **service** to and for others - to be the loving presence of God in our world.

## THE WORD

**ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:** Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One; let the earth be opened and bring forth a Saviour.

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved.

V.1 O Shepherd of Israel, hear us, shine forth from your cherubim throne.

O Lord, rouse up your might, O Lord, come to our help. **R.**

V. 2 God of hosts, turn again, we implore, look down from heaven and see.

Visit this vine and protect it, the vine your right hand has planted. **R.**

V. 3 May your hand be on the man you have chosen, the man you have given your strength.

And we shall never forsake you again: give us life that we may call upon your name. **R.**

**GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:** Alleluia, alleluia! I am the servant of the Lord: may his will for me be done. Alleluia!

## **Music**

1 Samuel 16:18-23 recalls a story when the Spirit of the Lord departed from King Saul and an evil spirit of the Lord\* tormented him. This caused much trouble for King Saul. Being consulted by his servants, King Saul sought out a man who was skillful in playing the harp. It happened to be the handsome, youngest, of Jesse's sons – David. So whenever the harmful, tormenting, evil spirit came to Saul, it was the music from David's harp that healed the king.

I have found enormous peace and calm when listening to instrumental music before weekday Masses, in the hospital or at home eg- Ave Maria, O Come Immanuel which we will listen to during the Offertory this Sunday.

(\*) Saul is made a terror to himself. If God and his grace do not rule us, sin and Satan will have possession of us. The devil, by God's permission, troubled and terrified Saul, by the corrupt humours of his body, and passions of his mind. He grew fretful, peevish, and discontented, and at times a madman. (*Matthew Henry's Commentary*)

## **St Joseph**

In the story of Jesus' birth, Joseph was called to let go of his own agenda in order to embrace the expansiveness of a God whose ways were always beyond his imagining. Reflect on a time when our personal world was shattered. What was that shattering experience like for us? What did God call us to do in that situation? What was our response in that situation?

Joseph's life was filled with fears and tensions: an arduous trek across inhospitable lands to Bethlehem with Mary who was nine months pregnant; the traumatic flight into Egypt; three days and nights of frantic searching and unspeakable agony, for Joseph when the child Jesus appeared lost ... Through all these ups and downs of his life, Joseph handled the tensions and fears with considerable grace. In a nutshell, Joseph clung to what really mattered: his trust in God's goodness and providence.

Please continue to pray for me as I prepare to undertake my new role in the Archdiocese at Ministry to Priests.

Joseph can be a companion in the Advent journey. He acts discreetly, humbly and silently, yet with an unflinching presence and utter fidelity, even when he finds it hard to understand.

## **Blessed Virgin Mary**

Mary, a silent, pregnant young woman, is present as one waiting in hope for God to act. The pregnant Mary reminds us that new life comes at its own rate of growth, according to laws that do not yield to a desire for quick results. She speaks to all of us caught up in a fast-paced world, and instant sensational social media. In a culture that disposes quickly of what isn't working, that has little patience with either fragility or weakness, Mary reminds us that we have to wait for some things.

Like her, we may be called to witness to a God who works in the fullness of time, which can be excruciatingly slow for those who live by a schedule. This is happening in our parish while we await Fr Raju Jacob's arrival (13/01/2016), exploring, listening, discussing and discerning a way forward with our three churches, three schools, three parishes, and a convent in order to serve the People of God in Ivanhoe better. Throughout the history of salvation, God proves to be a God of new life, full of surprises, a God who is Emmanuel, God-with-us.

Mary ultimately is our Advent companion, because she is carrying the Word-Incarnate herself. All that Jesus needed to take to himself to redeem us, and to share our human existence, he takes from Mary: through her capacity to die, she gives him; her capacity to experience human suffering, she gives him. If Jesus takes his flesh from Mary, then she is our companion who leads us into our deepest union with her Son, Jesus. It is in the joys and hopes, anguish and anxiety of our lives which are now the place where Christ forges a union between himself and humankind.

Maranatha – Emmanuel – Amen.  
Come, O Lord – God-with-us – Amen.
