FROM PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL - 23 MAY

Plenary Council: The PPC is encouraging all parishioners to participate in the preparations that will lead us towards the reform and renewal Plenary Council in 2020. The PPC will help facilitate your participation over the months ahead through small group discussion, online feedback, meetings with neighbouring parishes and through our local Deanery Network. All Parish groups, families, individuals and friends are encouraged to informally, honestly and humbly discuss these questions:

- ◆ **Where are we now?**
- ◆ **What do we want the Church to look like in 2025?**
- ◆ **How do we get there?**

Whenever you gather together with Catholic family and friends, lapsed or practising, throw these questions around the table, over a pizza or a bottle of wine. Discuss, listen, discern. Most importantly have a scribe record the responses and email them to bill.edebohls@cam.org.au so that we can build up a Parish response to feed into the Council deliberations (or sent written notes to the Parish Office).

Parish Redevelopment Project: To ensure that all parishioners are aware of, and understand, the history, the progress (or lack thereof), where we are at, and where we are heading with our Parish Development Project we are producing a booklet telling the story so far. This will be published on our website and will be available in hard copy next weekend. To date there has still been no decision on the heritage listing of the Mary Immaculate Church by Heritage Victoria.

Parish Retreat Day: Our retreat day conducted by Br. Mark O'Connor was attended by thirty people and was a wonderful day of reflection on the teaching of Pope Francis.

Parish Patron: Lamenting the fact that the Parish of Ivanhoe is probably the only Parish in the Archdiocese that does not have a Patron Saint or Title it was suggested that we petition the Archbishop to grant the Parish the Patronal Title "St. Mary, Mother of the Church". A Parish's Patronal Title does not refer to or change the title of any of our churches or schools it simply refers to the canonical entity of the geographical Parish as a whole. Mary, Mother of the Church was suggested because it was a title given to Mary by the 2nd Vatican Council and was, this year, proclaimed a Feast Day by Pope Francis to be celebrated the day after Pentecost Sunday. It's connection to Pentecost and the outpouring of the Spirit upon the Church and the fact that it does reflect the Marian character of all three of our churches makes this a very appropriate title. COLLECTIONS: JUST HOW MANY TIMES DO WE HAVE TO PASS THE PLATE AROUND?



I've always been amused by the number of times some churches pass the plate around during Mass. God knows what visiting non-churchgoers must think when the plate comes around a second time and sometimes even a third. *"Well they obviously didn't get enough last time round so they're having another go at it!"*

I know two collections are common in the Catholic Church but Ivanhoe is the only parish where I have experienced it as the Parish Priest. It annoys me on two counts:

i: It becomes a real intrusion into the Liturgy. Traditionally the gifts of the people are collected at the offertory. Outside of that ritual action another collection is meaningless and intrusive.

ii: It insults our intelligence and our willingness to give sacrificially. Surely we are mature enough to prayerfully and sacrificially give towards the work and mission of the church and do it in one hit!

Well come the first weekend in June we are biting the bullet and moving to one collection only during Mass. We already use one envelope for both our Parish and Presbytery giving and we will divide the single loose collection between Parish and Presbytery. This will bring us into line with our neighbouring parishes of St. Pius X West Heidelberg, St. John's Heidelberg and St. Martin's Rosanna.

As some have reminded me - it is a risk. And we may undermine the Presbytery Account (2nd collection) which is already sometimes unable to cover the minimum stipend. My simple response to that is surely we have the intelligence and the good will to put into one collection what we previously put into two collections.

So, from the first weekend in June, the plate will only be passed around once during Mass - at the offertory - so please ensure that your offering for both the Parish and the Presbytery goes into the plate. There will be no second collection after communion - no second chance!

If I'm proved wrong and it all goes down the financial gurgler and the parish can no longer afford its own priest then the Parish of Ivanhoe can simply become an outpost of West Heidelberg.

Just to add a little confusion - on the 1st weekend of each month we will still have our special collection - but that is after Mass as we leave church and is always for a special cause outside the parish - like charitable works, the missions or overseas aid.
